He gained a BA (Hons) in History from the University of Lancaster, an MA in English Local History from the University of Leicester and a PhD in medieval maritime and technological history from the University of Keele.

× Dr. Lynn Forest-Hill is a medievalist and a Visiting Fellow of the Centre for Medieval and Renaissance Culture at the University of Southampton. As a writer whose research and publications range from medieval drama to Shakespeare's *The Tempest*, she extended her research into the famous 14th century romance *Bevis of Hampton*, publishing a translation of the earliest English version in 2015.

Having previously written for 2000AD, the British science fiction comic, Will Gill has combined a career in the legal profession with a passion for writing fiction and non-fiction. For the graphic novel Agincourt 1415 Will worked with a team of talented professionals from the UK comics scene to bring the battle to life on the printed page with an almost cinematic eye to events, to entertain and educate readers of all ages.

× Cassandra Clark has written award-winning scripts for theatre, radio and television. She now writes the medieval mystery series Hildegard of Meaux set in the time of Richard II. Six
